

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH REGULATIONS REGARDING LENTEN FAST & ABSTINENCE

ABSTINENCE from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on **"Ash Wednesday"** and on all **"Fridays of Lent."** This Lenten obligation forbids the eating of meat - but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even if these were made from animal fat.

FASTING means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast on **"Ash Wednesday"** and **"Good Friday."** On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain health and strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days should be avoided.


THE LIVING LAST SUPPER

February 22, 2023 @ 7:30 p.m.



In 1492, Leonardo Da Vinci was commissioned by the Duke of Milan to create an inspirational mural in the dining hall of the Convent of *Santa Maria Delle Grazie*. Da Vinci chose to paint the last Passover Meal of Jesus with his disciples - just a few days before his crucifixion. During that dramatic moment, Jesus told the twelve: "*Amen, I say to you, one of you shall betray me.*" To which each disciple asked him: "*Is it I, Lord*?"

As we begin the SEASON OF LENT, we stage **THE LIVING LAST SUPPER** to help us reflect on the many ways we also betray our Lord Jesus Christ. Because LENT is a time for us to be more mindful of our fallen human nature, we make amends during this time to enhance our faith lives: to pray more, to fast/abstain and to be more charitable. This theatrical production has been a part of our Lenten tradition here at St. Paul for the last five years now. For this coming LENTEN SEASON, after the evening Mass of ASH WEDNESDAY (February 22), members of our faith family will bring to life this pivotal moment in our salvation history. Jesus asked his disciples, and he is asking us now: *"Will you spend an hour with me?"*



THE WOMEN AT THE PASSION

March 29, 2023 @ 6:00 p.m.



This theatrical production was borne out of over two decades of leading a beloved Lenten devotion we call *The Stations of the Cross.* I was also inspired by our staging of the *Living Last Supper of Jesus* here at St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church. In that production, certain men in our parish enact the characters of Jesus and his twelve disciples. For many years, I have been ruminating over this question: *"What about the women present at the Passion of Jesus? What were they feeling and thinking? How were they engaged in our Lord's Via Dolorosa, His Way of Suffering?"* In this play, the women are back, front and center during the Passion of Jesus. Guided by Scriptures and theological research, and inspired by some sacred & popular hymns, I hope I have given a gracious and thoughtful voice to the female characters who were actively involved in the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ.
